USEF MEMBERSHIP STATEMENT

Life, senior active and junior active members shall be eligible to participate in all classes at Regular Competitions, Eventing Competitions at the Preliminary Level or above and Combined Driving Competitions at the Advanced Level, Dressage, Reining and Vaulting Competitions and Endurance Rides. A nonmember may participate as a handler, rider, driver, owner, lessee, agent, coach or trainer at Regular Competitions, Eventing Competitions, Dressage Competitions, Reining Competitions and Combined Driving Competitions upon payment of a \$30 nonmember registration fee. Participants in the following classes are exempted from the Requirements of this rule: 1) leadline; 2) exhibitions; 3) games and races; 4) classes for 4-H members; 5) walk trot and academy classes (academy classes are classes limited to horses used regularly in a lesson program); 6) USDF introductory level tests, pas de deux and quadrille classes; 7) NRHA Endorsed Reining Competitions. 8) Opportunity classes, 9) citizens of other nations who have proof, in English, of current membership in good standing of their own National Federation, 10) USEA beginner novice division; and 11) assistant handlers in Dressage Sport Horse Breeding classes.

2011 Zone 9 Specifications (MT, WY, ID, OR, WA)

In accordance with GR 1111.4: **CA, NV, UT, CO, ND, SD, NE, and Canada are contiguous states.**

Adult Amateur Hunter:

To be ridden by Amateurs who are no longer eligible to compete as Junior Exhibitors. Horses and Adult Amateur riders entered in Adult Amateur Hunter sections may not compete in the Amateur Owner Hunter section at the same show. Riders may not show in any classes in which the fences are 3'9" and over at the same show. Ponies may be ridden by adults, suitability to count. Fence height not to exceed 3'.

Horses and ponies NOT to jog for soundness. Adult Amateur Hunter Classics to count bonus points. **Age groups for awards are 18-35, 36 and over.**

Children's Hunter Horse:

Open to horses to be ridden by a Junior Exhibitor. Horses and riders entered in the Children's Hunter section may not compete in the Junior Hunter section at the same show. Riders may not show in any classes in which the fences are 3'9" and over at the same show. Fence height not to exceed 3'. Horses NOT to jog for soundness. Children's Hunter Classics to count bonus points.

Children's Hunter Pony:

Open to ponies with a current USEF measurement card. Riders may not cross enter into any rated divisions. Small ponies to jump 2', Medium ponies to jump 2'3", Large ponies to jump 2'6". A year end award will be given.

Pre-Green Hunter:

A Pre-Green hunter is a horse in its first two consecutive years of showing at 3' or 3'3", regardless of age, that has never shown at 3'6". Pre-Green horses may not be reinstated. Fences: 3' - 3'3". Horses may not cross-enter into 3'6" divisions. Horses not to jog. To be judged on performance. **There will be two annual awards for the Pre-Green sections: 3' and 3'3".**

CLOSING OF ENTRIES: Entries close Oct 29, 2011. Entries may be sent to Wade Worley by:

ENTRY PROCEDURES:

Only complete entries, by the following specifications, will be accepted. Incomplete entries will not be processed. Exhibitors must pay either by cash or check on the day of the horse show. Exhibitors may choose to pre-pay all fees before the closing date of entries. All accounts to be closed by 6:00pm on the day of the horse show. To be complete, entry forms must include: (i) Horse's name and complete descriptions, (ii) All classes or sections entered, (iii) All mandatory signatures, and (iv) Organization membership numbers. Trainers and owners may leave a signed open checks during the horse show. No personal checks will be cashed at the show. Please plan accordingly.

CREDENTIALS: Participants must present the following credentials for their points to count: **It is strongly recommend that photo copies be sent in with your entry.** USEF/USHJA/ASPCA/EC membership card USEF/USHJA horse recording or ID number USEF/USHJA amateur certification

RETURNED CHECKS: There will be a penalty of \$50 per check returned by the bank for any reason. No checks will be processed through the bank a second time. If a check is returned after the horse show, it will be handled in accordance with USEF GR913.

USEF FEES: For every horse participating in any competition recognized by the USEF, a \$15 USEF fee will be collected (\$7 shall be a Drugs & Medication fee to provide for research, inspection and enforcement of rules regarding use of medications and drugs; see GR407.1.2&3). And a \$2 USHJA Zone Fee

MEMBERSHIP CERTIFICATION: Participants (in other than opportunity classes) must present to the show secretary a current U.S. Equestrian Federation membership card or copy thereof., or if not a member must pay a \$30 nonmember registration. Membership may be obtained online at USEF.org, or at the show. Exhibitors and trainers must be current members of the ASPCA/NHSAA and must show their ASPCA numbers on the entry blank. THIS, Open to all Junior members of the USEF and Equine Canada who have never competed in a National Equitation Final with fences at 3'6". ARIAT, Open to all Amateur members of USEF and Equine Canada who are eligible to compete in the Adult Amateur Hunter Section at this show. **A rider may not compete at the same horse show in any hunter or equitation class in which the jumps exceed three feet, three inches (3'3").**

MANAGEMENT: Management reserves the right to cancel any classes that do not fill to their satisfaction. Management will provide a full refund of entry fees for classes that do not fill or are cancelled due to severe weather or other emergency. Management reserves the right to start the first class of any session 30 minutes earlier than the scheduled time if entries or weather warrants and can make changes of arenas, judges, schooling or class orders to facilitate time schedule and conditions.

POST ENTRIES AND CHANGES: Post entries and changes to entries will be accepted before a class for an additional charge of \$5 per class.

TROPHIES, RIBBONS, PRIZE MONEY: Trophy and ribbons will be awarded to eight places in all classes. No prize money is offered.

HORSE SHOW OFFICE HOURS: 8:00am-6:00pm on the day of the horse show.

STABLING: A limited number of permanent 12'x12' stalls with doors will be available beginning Friday for a charge of \$60 for a day or \$90 for two days. Please indicate arrival and departure date and who you are to be stabled with on the entry blank.

HAUL-INS: There will be a \$30 fee

SCHOOLING AND EXERCISE: Schooling/warm-up areas will be available from Friday 4pm to 7:00pm & Saturday 7am to 8:45am on the day of the horse show. Management may limit Schooling in the show rings to preserve footing conditions.

MOTORIZED VEHICLES: MINORS WHO DO NOT HAVE A VALID DRIVER'S LICENSE WHICH ALLOWS THEM TO OPERATE A MOTORIZED VEHICLE IN THE STATE IN WHICH THEY RESIDE WILL NOT BE PERMITTED TO OPERATE A MOTORIZED VEHICLE OF ANY KIND, INCLUDING BUT NOT LIMITED TO, GOLF CARTS, MOTORCYCLES, SCOOTERS, OR FARM UTILITY VEHICLES, ON THE COMPETITION GROUNDS OF RECOGNIZED COMPETITIONS. MINORS WHO HAVE A VALID TEMPORARY LICENSE MAY OPERATE THE ABOVE-DESCRIBED MOTORIZED VEHICLES AS LONG AS THEY ARE ACCOMPANIED BY AN ADULT WITH A VALID DRIVER'S LICENSE. VIOLATIONS OF THIS RULE WILL BE CAUSE FOR SANCTIONS AGAINST THE PARENT(S), GUARDIAN(S), AND/OR TRAINER(S) WHO ARE RESPONSIBLE FOR THE CHILD COMMITTING THE OFFENSE. PENALTIES MAY INCLUDE EXCLUSION OF THE CHILD, PARENT(S), GUARDIAN(S), AND/OR TRAINER (S) FROM THE COMPETITION GROUNDS FOR THE REMAINDER OF THE COMPETITION AND CHARGES BEING FILED AGAINST ANY OF THE ABOVE INDIVIDUALS IN ACCORDANCE WITH USEF RULE 7. WHEELCHAIRS AND OTHER MOBILITY ASSISTANCE DEVICES FOR INDIVIDUALS WITH DISABILITIES ARE EXEMPT FROM THIS RULE.**DOGS:** Dogs must be on a leash at all times and Owners will be fined \$50 for dogs loose on the grounds (\$100 in arena/schooling areas).

ARENAS & FOOTING: Indoor Ring is 100'x200' - Hogs Fuel, Outdoor Ring is 120'x240' - Sand, Indoor Warm-up 60x100 - Hogs Fuel.

PROTECTIVE HEADGEAR: In accordance with Rule GR801, **all exhibitors must wear protective head gear** (that meets or exceeds ASTM standards and carry the SEI tag) while mounted anywhere on the show grounds. In addition, all junior riders must comply with USEF GR318. Any rider violating these rules at any time will immediately be prohibited from further riding until his/her head gear is properly In compliance with these rules.

CONDITIONS OF COMPETITION: Every class offered herein which is covered by the rules and specifications of the current USEF Rule Book will be conducted and judged in accordance therewith. Cornerstone Equestrian will in no case be responsible for any loss or damage that may occur and it shall be a condition of entry that each exhibitor shall hold Cornerstone Equestrian, The United States Equestrian Federation, the ASPCA and the National Horse Show Association of America (including their officers, directors, officials, agents, servants, volunteers and employees) harmless for any illness, loss or accident which may occur by fire or otherwise. All owners and competitors are personally responsible for damages to third persons caused by themselves, their employees, their agents or their horses/ponies. They therefore are strongly advised to take out third-party insurance providing full coverage for participation in equestrian events at home and abroad, and to keep the policy up to date.

Motorized Vehicle Statement In accordance with GR1301.7: Minors who do not have a valid driver's license which allows them to operate a motorized vehicle in the state in which they reside will not be permitted to operate a motorized vehicle of any kind, including, but not limited to, golf carts, motorcycles, scooters, or farm utility vehicles, on the competition grounds of licensed competitions. Minors who have a valid temporary license may operate the above described motorized vehicles as long as they are accompanied by an adult with a valid driver's license. **The parent(s), or individual who signs the entry blank as a parent or guardian of a minor operating a motorized vehicle in violation of this rule are solely responsible for any damages, claims, losses or actions resulting from that operation.** Violations of this rule will be cause for sanctions against the parent(s), guardian(s) and/or trainer(s) who are responsible for the child committing the offense. Penalties may include exclusion of the child, parent(s), guardian(s), and/or trainer(s) from the competition grounds for the remainder of the competition and charges being filed against any of the above individuals in accordance with Chapter 6. Wheelchairs and other mobility assistance devices for individuals with disabilities are exempt from this rule.

SPECIFICATIONS OF MEDALS - USEF, ASPCA, USET, ARIAT, THIS Pessoa/USEF National Hunter Seat Medal.....\$60

9a. Open to Junior Active Members of the Federation who have not yet reached their 18th birthday. Application for membership can be made direct to the Federation office or the exhibitor can join prior to the class through the steward. To be shown over a course of not less than eight obstacles at 3'6" which must include one combination including an oxer and two changes of direction (change of lead) after the first obstacle. Two cumulative refusals in the USEF Hunter Seat Medal Finals will result in elimination, see EQ110.1. Two or more tests of at least the top four competitors are required. Tests 1-19. Any exhibitor who does not participate in the testing is placed last of those exhibitors called back to test. Should more than one exhibitor fail to return for testing they will be placed at the judge's discretion. Only one rider per horse. To fill a class six competitors must complete the course (five in Zones 6, 8, 11 and 12). For purposes of determining the number of entries for the increment system, the number of entries is determined by the number of exhibitors who compete in a class or section of the class. (See EQ110.5) If there are 50 or more entries at the beginning of this class, it must be divided by every other number and run as two or more separate sections. A class with fewer than 50 entries cannot be split. The USEF Hunter Seat Medal Finals will be judged by at least one judge who holds an "R" Registered status in the Hunter Seat Equitation Division. Additional judges are eligible to judge if they have 'r' recorded status.

b. Schooling Rules for all Medal Classes

(1) Follow USEF Jumper Schooling Rules (see JP Appendix A) EXCEPT that Swedish Oxers (maximum 12" difference), tarps, coolers and liverpools are acceptable.

c. Schooling Rules for Medal Finals

(1) One hour before the class begins competition management will set in place the jumps in the schooling area(s). The jumps will be flagged to show the direction of the jumps. These flags may be changed, red on right, white on left.

(2) Verticals can be made into oxers and oxers can be made into verticals. The jumps may be raised or lowered, widened or narrowed.

d. Qualifying

(1) The points that a rider needs to qualify will be determined by his state residence. The points required by each individual state will be determined by the population density of that state for Junior riders designated Hunter or Jumper combined with the number of USEF Medal classes held in that state. Each year the Current State Groups will be recalculated. The number of points required by each state will be posted at the beginning of the each qualifying period on the USEF website. See chart in EQ112.9d(2) for each group's required points to qualify. See chart EQ 112.9.d.3 for current year Medal State Groups. All riders may continue to compete even after qualifying for the finals.

ASPCA Horsemanship - Maclay Class\$60

Open to Junior Riders who have not reached their 18th birthday. Rider and trainer must be current members of the ASPCA/NHSAA, and must show their ASPCA numbers on the entry blank. Junior rider annual contributions shall be \$35. Trainer annual contribution shall be \$50. Fees should be payable and sent directly to the National Horse Show Association of America, P.O. Box 386, Greenvale, NY 11548. All contestants are required to perform over at least eight fences at 3'6" with or without wings. Two cumulative refusals in the ASPCA Maclay Finals will result in elimination, see EQ110.1. A minimum of twelve riders, if available, are required to show at a walk, trot and canter. To be judged on seat, hands, guidance and control of horse. The Under Saddle performance of those riders selected to show under saddle shall count 50%. Only one rider per horse. USEF Tests 1-19. To fill a class six (6) competitors must complete the course (five in Alaska and Hawaii). If 50 or more entries are received three hours prior to the class, the class must be divided by every other number and run as two separate classes. In order to qualify for the Regional Finals conducted by the National Horse Show, a contestant must win the following: In CT, NJ, NY a rider must win 60 pts.; in FL, MA, PA, and RI 38 pts.; in AL, CA, DE, GA, IA, IL, MD, MN, NC, NE, ND, NV, OH, OK, SC, SD, TN, VA and WI 25 pts.; in all other states, Canada and Puerto Rico 13 pts.

Once a rider has qualified for his/her Maclay regional final, he/she may continue to ride in the Maclay classes until he/she has acquired 60 points. Any rider who willfully continues to compete after they have acquired 60 points may be ineligible for the regional final. For complete details on application to offer this class, as well as instructions on submitting results, competition management should contact the National Horse Show at 516-484- 1865. Classes held after August 31 will count toward the next year's finals. Any rider who will not be eligible to compete in the next year as a junior should not compete in qualifying classes after August 31.

Class 5 Platinum Performance/USEF Talent Search...\$60

a test of the abilities of an individual as a show jumping rider, is open to Junior/Young Riders who are members of the Federation, who have not reached their 21st birthday under Federation rules.

a. Winners of twenty Talent Search Classes **may compete in the Finals if they have not reached their 21st birthday under Federation rules, but** are no longer eligible to compete in the USEF SHOW JUMPING TALENT SEARCH CLASS.

b. Winners of the Finals may continue to compete in the USEF SHOW JUMPING TALENT SEARCH CLASS, in pursuit of additional wins leading towards Gold, Silver and Bronze Medals in recognition of these wins **if they have not reached their 21st birthday under Federation rules**, but may not compete in future Finals.

c. Non-U.S. citizens may compete in the USEF SHOW JUMPING TALENT SEARCH CLASS, but not the Finals.

d. If 50 or more entries are received, the class must be divided equally and run as two separate classes.

e. All competitions planning to hold this class must apply at least four weeks prior to the competition to the United States Equestrian Federation office at the Lexington, KY address, for permission to hold the class. Please include the name of the competition, the dates, and the name and address of a contact person.

f. Competitors must use the same horse in both phases. Competitors may ride stallions.

Talent Search rules cont.

g. The jumping phase of the class shall be held first over a course of at least ten fences from 3'7" to 3'9" (1.10 - 1.15m.) in height with spreads to 4'11" (1.50m.). Each course must contain no fewer than three fences set at 3'9" in height. The course must include a double and a triple combination, or 3 doubles. Additional spread fences are required elsewhere on the course. **At "AA" rated outdoor competitions, a water-filled obstacle with a 10' (3.05m) to 12' (3.30m) spread (with an option) must be included. At all other rated competitions a liverpool is recommended.** At both East and West Coast Finals, a water obstacle of at least 10' (3.05m) is required. The course should be of the type used in a Junior Jumper class. Time allowed will be figured at 350 meters per minute; may be timed either electronically or manually. To be judged on style and execution. Time and jumping faults should be taken into consideration in the judge's evaluation of the rider. Two refusals will incur elimination.

h. At least 12 riders, if available, must be called back for the flat phase.

i. In the flat phase, riders will show as a group at the working walk, the working trot sitting, the working trot rising, as well as showing a lengthening of stride; the working canter, and the working canter showing a lengthening of stride. All riders being considered for an award shall be required to show the working canter on the counter lead for at least one full revolution of the arena in both directions, but not more than 12 shall counter canter at one time. Judges may require any additional tests. To be judged on rider's position and seat and the correctness and effect of the aids.

j. All riders must ride in the **jumping phase, which will be offered first and will** constitutes entry into the class as a whole, regardless of whether the rider is called back for the second, flat phase. To fill a class, SIX COMPETITORS MUST COMPLETE THE COURSE. **EC 9/20/10 Effective 12/1/10**

k. SADDLERY.

(1) There are no restrictions on saddles.

(2) Change of bridle is permissible, between phases.

(3) Blinkers are forbidden.

(4) No martingales of any kind are permitted in the flat phase.

(5) Only running martingales used in the conventional manner are permitted in the jumping phase.

Standing martingales, draw reins, or restricted running martingales are prohibited.

(6) Reins must be attached to the bit(s) or directly to the bridle. Gags and hackamores are not allowed in the flat phase.

TAYLOR HARRIS INSURANCE SERVICES CHILDREN'S MEDAL

Qualifying Period

All classes held at shows starting on or after August 21st of the previous year, through shows starting on or before August 20th of the current year will be counted toward this year's finals.

Class Specifications

Open to all Junior members of the USEF and Equine Canada who have never competed in a National Equitation Final with fences at 3'6" (i.e.; USEF Medal; ASPCA Maclay; USET; Equine Canada Finals; WIHS Equitation).

To be shown over a minimum of eight fences 2'9" to 3' in height, spread not to exceed fence height. The course may be either a Jumper or Hunter type course and must include at least two changes of direction and a combination. Water obstacles (i.e.; water jump, liverpool) are not permitted. The top four riders are required to perform at least two individual tests from USEF Tests 1-19. An Open Numerical Scoring System must be used in the first round, with each rider's score announced at the completion of their round. There is no minimum requirement to fill the class.

Approximately thirty riders will be invited to compete in the finals and will be chosen as follows; the high point rider in each of the regional series will be invited, along with additional riders working from the top down on the National Standings list for the qualifying period. Any unfilled slots will be chosen by continuing down the National Standings list. There will be no entry fee for the finals.

ARIAT NATIONAL ADULT MEDAL

Qualifying Period

All classes held at shows starting on or after August 21st of the previous year, through shows starting on or before August 20th of the current year will be counted toward this year's finals.

Class Specifications

Open to all Amateur members of USEF and Equine Canada who are eligible to compete in the Adult Amateur Hunter Section at this show. A rider may not compete at the same horse show in any hunter or equitation class in which the jumps exceed three feet, three inches (3'3").

Ariat con't

To be shown over a minimum of eight fences 2'9" to 3' in height, spread not to exceed fence height. The course may be either a Jumper or Hunter type course and must include at least two changes of direction and a combination. Water obstacles (i.e.; water jump, liverpool) are not permitted. The top four riders are required to perform at least two individual tests from USEF Tests 1-19. An Open Numerical Scoring System must be used in the first round, with each rider's score announced at the completion of their round. There is no minimum requirement to fill the class. Approximately thirty riders will be invited to compete in the finals and will be chosen as follows; the high point rider in each of the regional series will be invited, along with additional riders working from the top down on the National Standings list for the qualifying period. Any unfilled slots will be chosen by continuing down the National Standings list. There will be no entry fee for the finals.

OHJA Medal Classes

Year-end championships will be awarded in all OHJA Medal classes. All OHJA Medal Class participants must be junior or amateur members in good standing of the OHJA. A minimum of three (3) riders must complete the course for the class to count toward the OHJA Medal Finals and for the medal to be awarded. There must be a "ride-off" in each medal class between at least the top two (2) riders with four (4) recommended. In each of the OHJA Medal Finals, prizes shall be awarded through tenth (10th) place, entries permitting.

To qualify for the Medal Finals, riders must accumulate ten (10) points in medal classes. Points are accumulated toward the Medal Finals as follows: (a) 1st – 10 points; (b) 2nd – 6 points; (c) 3rd – 4 points; (d) 4th – 3 points; and (e) 5th – 2 points. After the close of entries for the show holding the OHJA Medal Finals, the Board gives show management the option to invite up to ten (10) additional riders based on number of points accumulated to date, starting with the highest, that have not yet reached the ten (10) point minimum. There will be a written test that will be taken by all participants in the OHJA Medal Finals classes. The score from this test will count toward the combined score for each competitor in the OHJA Medal Finals.

OHJA Mini Medal: Fence height not to exceed 2'6"; at Local System shows, no less than two (2) fences on course must be 2'6" in height. No cross entry with 3' medals. No one or two stride in-and-outs are permitted on course. *Riders who win a qualifying class may continue to compete until the Mini Medal Finals.* Medal winners in Mini Medal classes may compete in Children's or Adult medal classes; *however*, if they qualify for the Children's Medal Finals or Adult Medal Finals, they forfeit their right to compete in the Mini Medal Finals. As an alternative to competing and accumulating points at Regional System and Open System USEF "B" rated shows, a Local System rider may qualify for the Mini Medal Finals by competing and accumulating points *exclusively* at Local System shows. In *qualifying classes* in the Local System, show management is encouraged to limit the 'ride-off' to flat work in accordance with USEF Rule EQ 113(5), and/or horsemanship questions in accordance with USEF Rule EQ 113(8); *however*, in the *Regional and Open Systems*, the judge may use any test(s) listed in USEF Rule EQ 113. In the *Mini Medal Finals*, the "ride-off" *shall not* include any testing over fences.

OHJA Children's Medal: Fence height not to exceed 3'. Riders entered in a Children's Medal class may not cross enter into junior hunters, junior jumpers, or any 3'6" medal class at the same show; *however*, a rider competing in the Children's Medal Finals may cross enter into any division for which the rider is otherwise qualified. *Riders who win a qualifying class may continue to compete until the Children's Medal Finals.* Medal winners in Children's Medal classes may compete in Junior Medal classes; *however*, if they qualify for the Junior Medal Finals, they forfeit their right to compete in the Children's Medal Finals. If there are less than three (3) Children's riders in a qualifying class or at the Medal Finals, the class may be combined with the Adult Amateur Medal qualifying class and at the Adult Amateur Medal Finals.

OHJA Junior Medal: Fence height 3'6". Riders competing in Junior Hunter divisions are only eligible to compete in the Junior Medal classes. *Riders who win a qualifying class may continue to compete until the Junior Medal Finals.* In the Junior Medal Finals, if there are less than three (3) junior riders, the Junior and Senior Medal Finals shall be combined.

OHJA Adult Amateur Medal: Fence height not to exceed 3'. *Riders who win a qualifying class may continue to compete until the Adult Amateur Medal Finals.* If there are less than three (3) Adult Amateur riders in a qualifying class or at the Medal Finals, the class may be combined with the Children's Medal qualifying class and at the Children's Medal Finals.

OHJA Senior Medal: Fence height 3'6". *Riders who win a qualifying class may continue to compete until the Senior Medal Finals.* In the Senior Medal Finals, if there are less than three (3) senior riders, the Senior and Junior Medal Finals shall be combined.

USEF EQUITATION RULES

EQ108 Position.

1. General. Rider should have a workmanlike appearance, seat and hands light and supple, conveying the impression of complete control should any emergency arise. Exhibitors may ride side saddle in Adult Equitation classes but not in classes restricted to Juniors.
2. Hands. Hands should be over and in front of horse's withers, knuckles thirty degrees inside the vertical, hands slightly apart and making a straight line from horse's mouth to rider's elbow. Bight of reins may fall on either side. However, all reins must be picked up at the same time. When using two reins, the snaffle rein should be on the outside while the curb rein is on the inside.
3. Basic Position. The eyes should be up and shoulders back. Toes should be at an angle best suited to rider's conformation: ankles flexed in, heels down, calf of leg in contact with horse and slightly behind girth. Iron should be on the ball of the foot and must not be tied to the girth.
4. Position in Motion. At the walk, sitting trot and canter, body should be a couple of degrees in front of the vertical; posting trot, inclined forward; galloping and jumping, same inclination as the posting trot.
5. Mounting and Dismounting. To mount, take up reins in left hand and place hand on withers. Grasp stirrup leather with right hand and insert left foot in stirrup, toe in girth and mount. To dismount, rider may either step down or slide down. The size of rider must be taken into consideration.

EQ109 Appointments.

1. Personal. Exhibitors and judges should bear in mind that at all times entries are being judged on ability rather than on personal attire. Riders should wear coats of any tweed or Melton for hunting (conservative wash jackets in season), breeches or jodhpurs and boots. Conservative colored protective headgear with no additional adornments in accordance with GR801.3 is mandatory. Spurs, crops or bats are optional. Judges may penalize contestants who do not conform. When management permits Hunter or Hunter Seat Equitation riders to ride without jackets, riders must wear traditional, short, or long-sleeved riding shirts with chokers or ties. Polo shirts and chaps are not permitted except in unjudged warm-up classes. Management or Judge may eliminate an exhibitor who is inappropriately attired.
2. Tack. Regulation snaffles, pelhams and full bridles, all with cavesson nose bands, are recommended. Two-ring bits, three-ring bits and gags are not considered conventional equipment for hunter seat equitation classes. A judge at his own discretion can penalize a horse with nonconventional types of bits or nose bands. Boots and conservative colored bandages are permitted. Type of saddle is optional. Martingales are permitted in classes over obstacles and in the jumping phase of classes requiring both jumping and flat work. Changing of bits between phases is permissible.
3. No mounted exhibitor may wear or carry an electronic communication device (i.e., cellular telephone, pager, walkie talkie, etc.) while in the competition ring. The penalty for wearing or carrying a forbidden device if observed by the judge may be elimination from the class during which the device was worn or carried. Exception: A handicapped participant may use electronic devices if, prior to the class, he/she presents to the USEF Steward written justification from treating personnel setting forth the necessity of the equipment.

EQ110 Class Routine.

1. Over Obstacles. The performance begins when the horse enters the ring. Except for refusals jumping faults of the horse are not to be considered unless it is the result of the rider's ability. No rider can be eliminated until ten riders have completed the course, or a number equal to the ribbons being awarded. (Exception: three refusals, fall of horse and/or rider and off course). The following will result in elimination: a) fall of horse and/or rider; b) three cumulative refusals (exceptions: USEF Medal Finals, USEF Pony Medal Finals, Maclay Finals, **USEF Talent Search class and the WIHS Equitation Jumper phase**, exhibitors will be eliminated after two cumulative refusals); and c) off course. In the event of an elimination, the rider must exit the ring immediately. If elimination occurs during a rideoff, the competitor is placed last of all those chosen for the ride-off. The following constitute major faults and can be cause for elimination: a) a refusal; b) loss of stirrup; c) trotting while on course when not part of a test; and d) loss of reins. Each competitor may circle once before approaching the first obstacle. He then proceeds around course keeping an even pace throughout. If a refusal occurs in a double or triple, competitors must rejump all obstacles in the combination. Any or all competitors can be called back to perform at a walk, trot and canter or to execute any appropriate tests included in class requirements (see EQ112 and EQ113). In the event that a rail comes down, first score the knockdown within the context of the round. Unless the knock down is caused by a MAJOR rider error, it should not be considered a MAJOR riding fault.
2. Not to Jump. Competitors shall enter ring and proceed at least once around ring at each gait and, on command, reverse and repeat. Riders may be asked to work collectively without stirrups in Intermediate, 14 and over and Open classes. The order to reverse can be executed by turning either toward or away from the rail. Light contact with horse's mouth is required. Entries then line up on command. Any or all riders may be required to execute any appropriate tests included in class requirements (EQ112 and EQ113). All tests used must be on the flat. Judges are encouraged to call for at least two tests of the top contestants.
3. Outside Assistance. Outside assistance will be penalized at the judge's discretion.
4. In cases of broken equipment or loss of shoe, the competitor must continue or be eliminated.
5. The number of competitors who complete the course will be used in determining the **number of entrants for the increment system. BOD 1/17/10 Effective 12/1/10**

EQ111 Course Requirements.

Classes must be held over at least six obstacles.

1. In Maiden, Novice, Limit and classes for under 14 years, jumps cannot exceed 3' and wings must be at least 24" wide.
2. In Intermediate classes obstacles cannot exceed 3'3".
3. In Open, Medal and Classes for 14 to 18 years, obstacles cannot exceed 3'6" and wings are optional.
4. In Novice classes, a change of hand (change of lead) is required.
5. In Limit classes, a change of hand (change of lead) and a combination are required.
6. In Intermediate, 14 years and over and Open classes, at least one change of hand (change of lead) and a combination including an oxer are required.
7. Combinations are prohibited in classes restricted to riders 12 years old and under, unless required in specific Federation classes. All combinations must be numbered with a single number and the designations A and B or A, B and C on the course diagram. If only one element of a combination is being jumped, it must be the last element.
8. Verticals may be jumped in either direction provided ground lines are correct, i.e. No false ground lines.
9. It is recommended that one class in each competition be held over a jumper-type obstacles to encourage interest in FEI competition and one over hunter course so that riders can be judged on their ability to establish and maintain an even hunting pace.

10. In Open Equitation classes for riders 12 years of age and older, ASPCA Maclay classes, and all USEF Medal classes, the course must include at least one change of lead, a combination including an oxer and 1/3 of the obstacles must be oxers. In addition, all courses must include at least three of the following:

- a. Bending Line
- b. Narrow Jump (6'-8')
- c. Roll-back Turn
- d. Fence at the end of the ring
- e. Long approach to a single jump.

USEF Pony Medal classes and WIHS Pony Equitation classes may include any of the above. *BOD 1/17/10 Effective 12/1/10*

11. In USEF Hunter Seat Medal classes courses must be 3'6" with spreads to 4'. (Exception: triple bar type obstacles, maximum spread of 5'.) The top element of all obstacles must be securely placed so that a slight rub will not cause a knockdown. If breakaway or safety cups are used the top cup must be the deepest standard cup available.

12. If an option fence is used, a rider may choose to jump either fence. If the horse stops at one of the options, the rider is scored with a refusal and if the fence is dislodged must wait for the fence to be reset, but may then jump either option.

13. A Liverpool or water is prohibited in USEF Medal and ASPCA Maclay classes including Regionals and Finals.

EQ113 Tests From Which Judges Must Choose.

Tests may be performed either collectively or individually but no other tests may be used. Instructions must be publicly announced. A judge may ask riders to re-jump an abbreviated or shortened form of the original course. NOTE: In Hunter Seat Equitation classes, any exhibitor who does not participate in the testing is placed last of those competitors called back to test. Should more than one exhibitor fail to return for testing they will be placed at the judge's discretion. If exhibitors are called back collectively to test, they must remain in the ring until all exhibitors have completed the test. Equitation tests must not have exhibitors trotting or cantering through in gate or out gate. Obstacles jumped in an equitation test must have been included in the original course. *Jumps must be jumped in the original direction unless otherwise specified. BOD 1/17/10 Effective 12/1/10*

EC 9/20/10 Effective 12/1/10

1. Halt (4 to 6 seconds) or halt and back. When riders working collectively are asked to halt and then back, they must not be penalized if they walk forward a few steps and halt after backing.
2. Hand gallop.
3. Figure eight at trot, demonstrating change of diagonals. At left diagonal, rider should be sitting the saddle when left front leg is on the ground; at right diagonal, rider should be sitting the saddle when right front leg is on the ground; when circling clockwise at a trot, rider should be on left diagonal; when circling counterclockwise, rider should be on the right diagonal.
4. Figure eight at canter on correct lead, demonstrating simple change of lead. This is a change whereby the horse is brought back into a walk or trot (either is acceptable unless the judge specifies) and restarted into a canter on the opposite lead. Figures to be commenced in center of two circles so that one change of lead is shown.
5. Work collectively or individually at a walk, trot and/or canter.
6. Jump low obstacles at a trot as well as at a canter. The maximum height and spread for a trot jump is 3' for horses, 2' for ponies.
7. Jump obstacles on figure eight course.
8. Question(s) regarding basic horsemanship, tack and equipment and conformation.
9. Ride without stirrups, riders must be allowed option to cross stirrups.
10. Jump low obstacles at a walk as well as at a canter. The maximum height and spread for a walk jump is 2'.
11. Dismount and mount. Individually.
12. Turn on the forehand done through the walk or the halt.
13. Figure eight at canter on correct lead demonstrating flying change of lead.
14. Execute serpentine at a trot and/or canter on correct lead demonstrating simple or flying changes of lead. (See EQ113.4 for simple change.)
15. Change leads on a line demonstrating a simple or flying change of lead. (See EQ113.4 for simple change.)
16. Change horses. (Note: this test is the equivalent of two tests.)
17. Canter on counter lead. (Note: no more than twelve horses may counter canter at one time.)
18. Turn on the haunches from the walk.
19. Demonstration ride of approximately one minute. Rider must advise judge beforehand what ride he plans to demonstrate.
